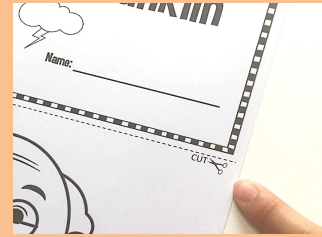


How to Assemble the Flip & Learn Book

You will see a little picture of a pair of scissors on every page. Cut along the dotted line.



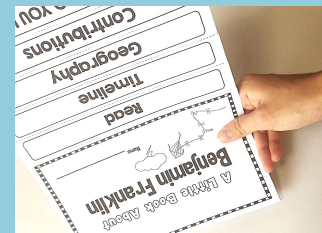

Tip: It's easier to flip the book upside down to line them up.



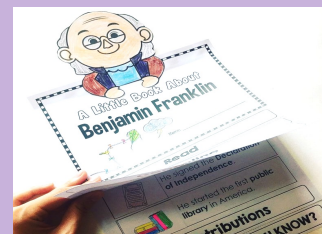

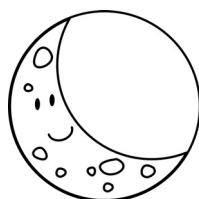
She helped hundreds of African Americans, poor, sick, and old people until her death.

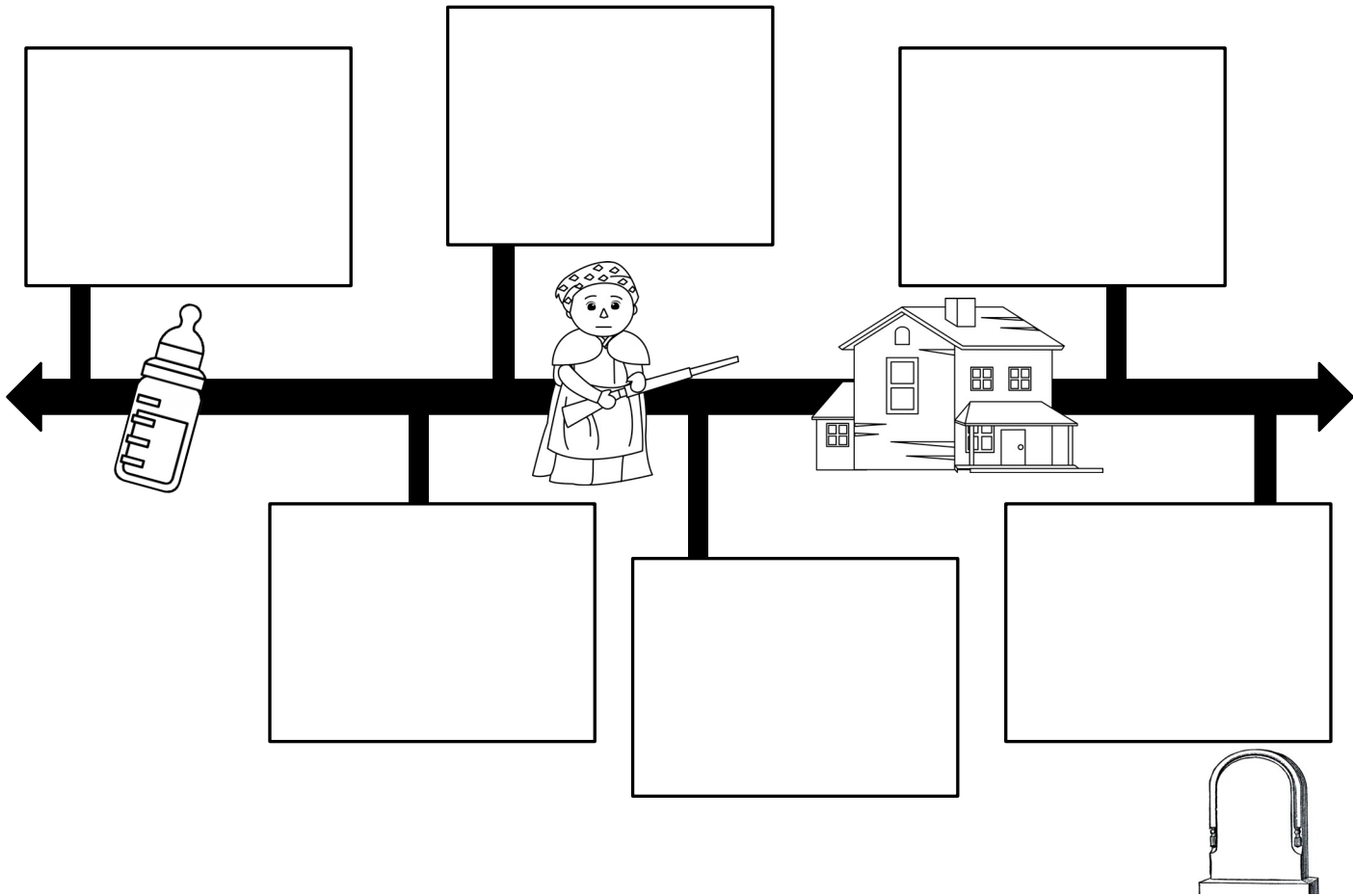

During the Civil War, Harriet Tubman was a nurse and a cook for the Union. During the war, she helped free more than 700 slaves in the South.

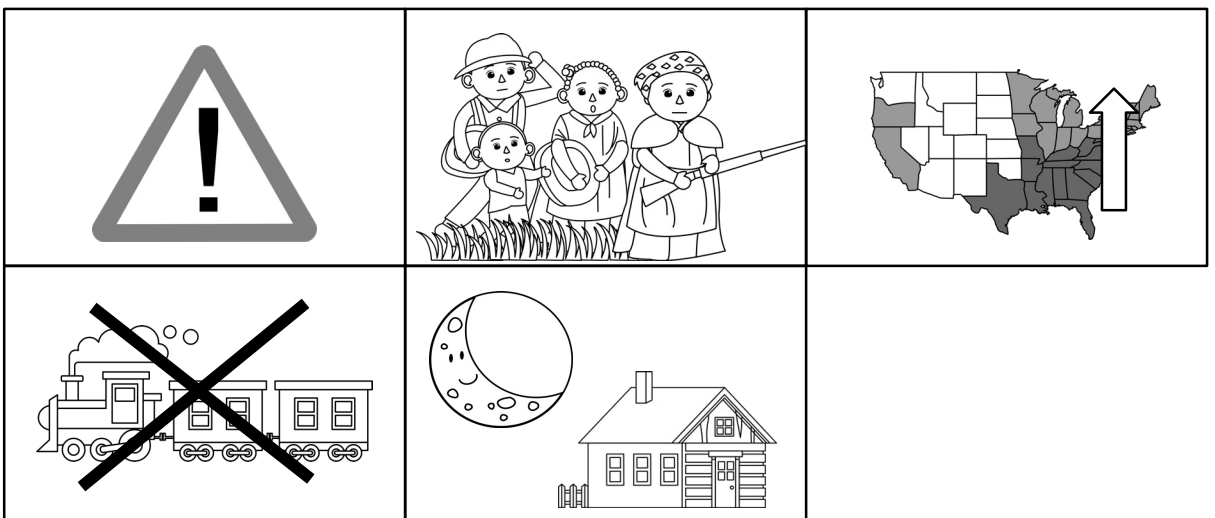

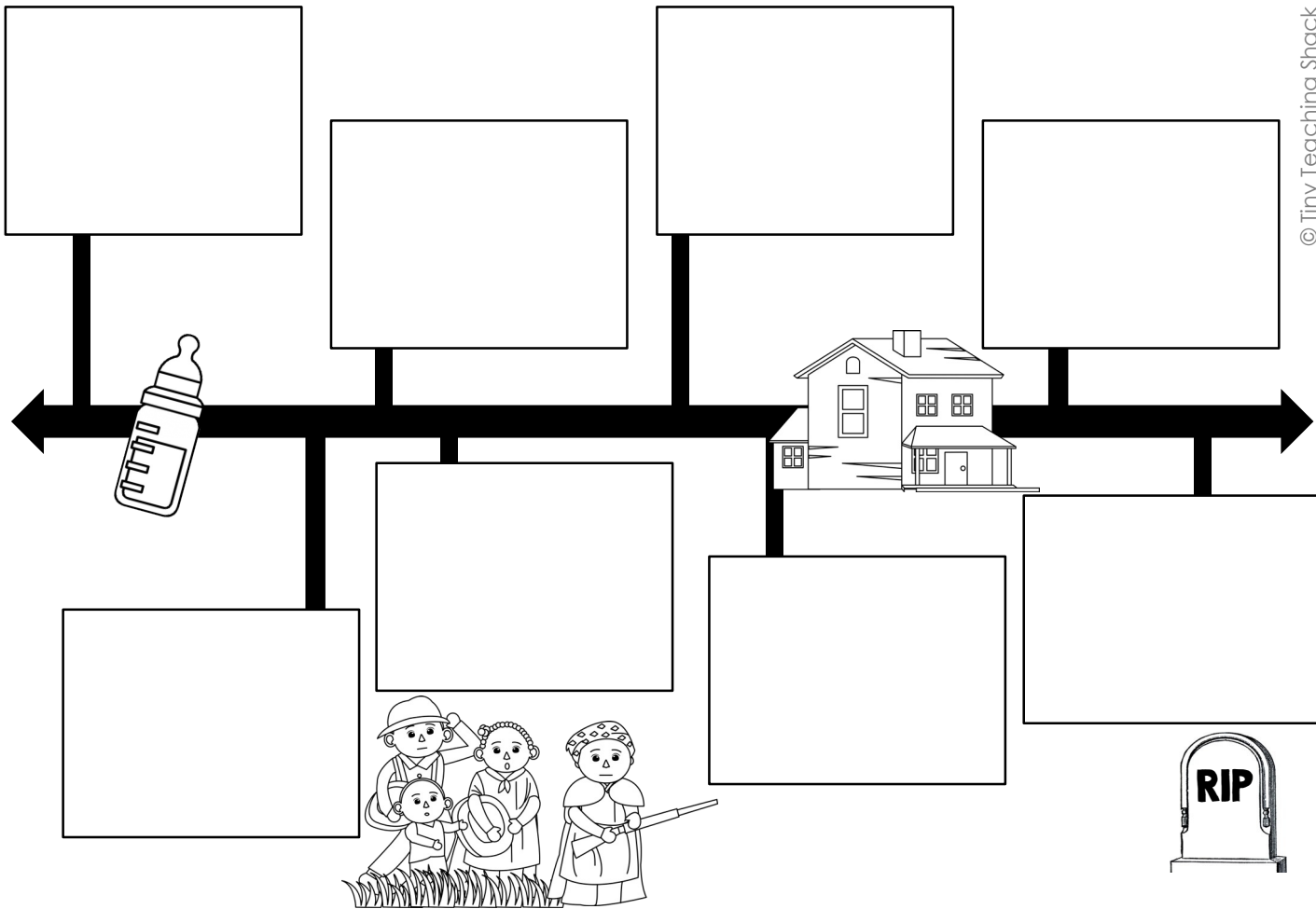

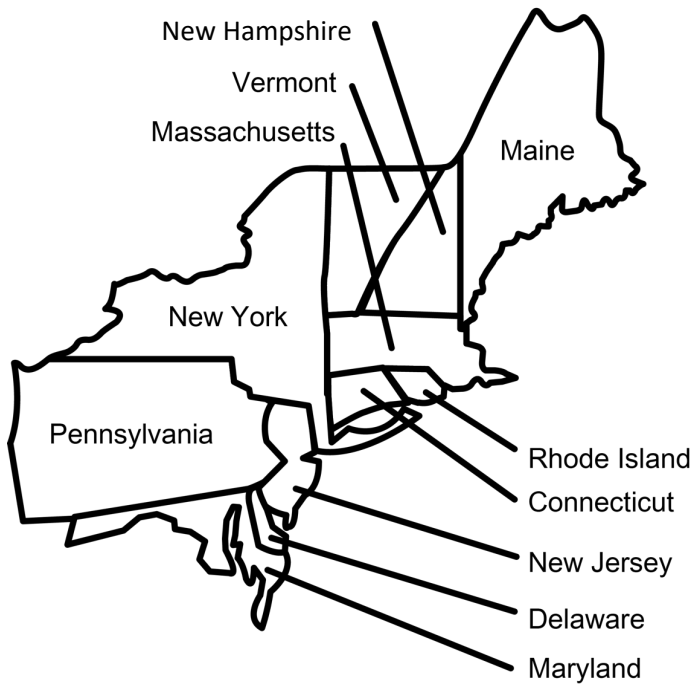

Harriet Tubman also served as a nurse and cooked for the Union during the Civil War. She soon became a spy and helped free more than 700 slaves in the South.

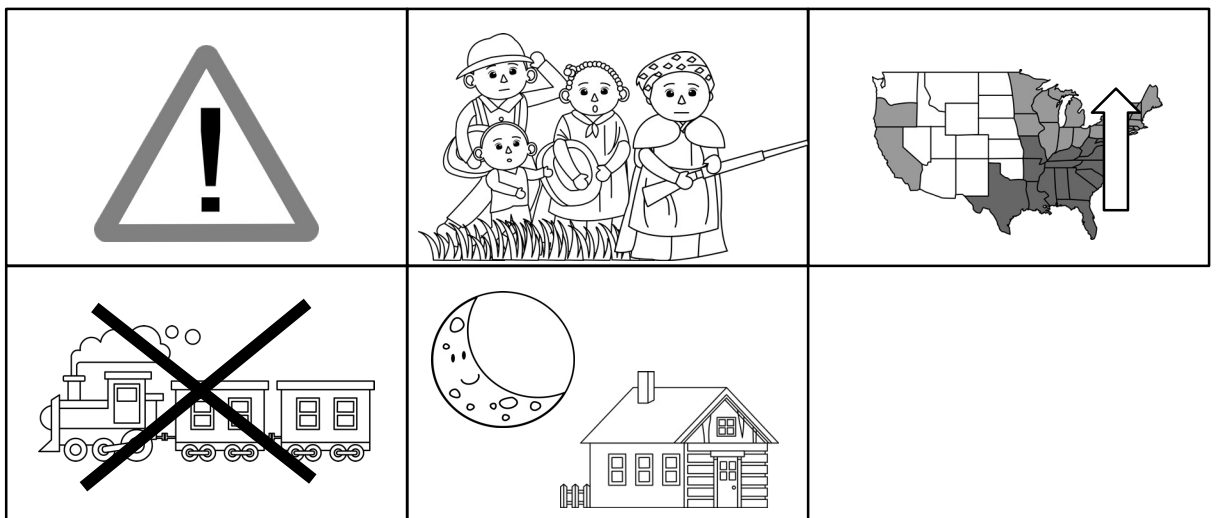
